For the six major death camps in Poland, the death-counts are:

Auschwitz	1,100,000 Jews and 200,000 others
Maidanek (Majdanek)	78,000 including 61,000 Jews, 12,000 Poles, 5,000 others including Soviet prisoners of war.
Chelmno	320,000
Treblinka	762,000
Sobibor	167,000
Belzec	434,000 - 500,000
Total fatalities	2,857,000 - 3,139,000

Treblinka	40 – 70 *	870,000 **	Exhume bodies from the huge mass graves, burn them on pyres made from railroad rails, sift the bones from the ash, crush the bones, then throw all the teeth, crushed bone, and ash back into the huge mass graves and cover the remains with a layer of soil

* The following is from (chapter 4.3) from Arnulf Neumaier's THE TREBLINKA HOLOCAUST:
*“Regarding the claim that the **870,000** corpses were eliminated completely without any trace, we must consider the quantities of ashes that remain... The ash content of a human body makes up about 5.6% of the body's weight; given a 132 lb. body, this comes to 7.3 lbs. The remains from the **870,000** burned bodies would thus have weighed **6,351,000 pounds**, all of which (according to the witnesses), were then thrown back into the pits, which would be easy to find in the quantity alleged by the witnesses. It must also be noted that in the “incineration” of corpses under the conditions specified by the witnesses, **the bones would not have turned to ash, but would have remained as bones.**”*
